## CRA UPDATE

Report on the Six (6) assessment criteria for CRA exams:

1. Bank's loan to deposit ratio: 69.73%

\*Quarterly average for the year ending 12/31/2023. This is an increase compared to 61.94% in 2022 mainly due to increase in deposits.

2. Percentage of loans made in the bank's assessment. (Burke County):

\*Year ending 12/31/2023, our bank made approximately 80% of its loans and 74% of its volume to borrowers in our assessment area (Burke County). This is monitored monthly.

3. Distribution of loans between different income levels.

\*Fair Lending and Compliance reviews support our bank's commitment to low income families and small businesses.

4. Geographic distribution of loans with the bank's assessment area.

\*Our bank is tracking the Geo location codes. During 2023 there were 1589 loans made.


